

INTRODUCTION



Born in 1923 in Prague, Czechoslovakia, Jindrich (Henry) Degen has enjoyed drawing since childhood. After completing secondary education, he chose to pursue his other great interest, music, following in the footsteps of his father. From 1943 until 1979 he performed as principal oboist in various symphony and opera orchestras in

Prague (now Czech Republic), Gothenburg (Sweden), and Melbourne (Victoria, Australia). He also published educational music for oboe in Prague, England and Germany.

After his retirement in 1979, Jindrich moved from Victoria to Queensland where he began devoting himself to art. While living on the Sunshine Coast, he took a three-year art course at the TAFE (Technical And Further Education) institute in the area. Later in the Redlands, as a member of the Yurara Art Society, he attended workshops conducted by prominent artists, Irene Amos, Jan Jefferies, Jack Oudyn, and Michael John Taylor.

Jindrich's subject repertoire is diverse, directed by his personal mood or idea at the time. He enjoys painting realistic subjects, such as portraits, townscapes, still lifes, and nature themes. Through colourful semi-abstract or abstract art, he seeks to express his subconscious feelings in images using various media (such as oil, acrylic, pastel and watercolour). Many of these can

be seen on his website www.henrydegen.com, as well as in an earlier publication entitled *Artistic Inspirations, Paintings by Jindrich Degen* (published in 2011).

A respected local artist, Jindrich continues to take part in various art activities and exhibitions, especially those of the Yurara Art Society. During March-April 2004, he had a solo exhibition in the Redland Art Gallery. In July-August 2010, he displayed a selection of his mandala paintings at the same gallery. Another exhibition is planned for 2014.

This new book of 112 pictures is a selection of drawings and paintings representing Jindrich's artistic endeavours over the last three decades. The collection contains real-life portraits as well as images and portraits based on the works of other artists. Some of the works in the book are the product of Jindrich's own imagination. In addition, there is a section containing icons and symbols and two sections picturing animals (domestic and wild).



This collection of art works has been arranged by Jindrich's daughter, Eva, with assistance from her husband Alex. Jindrich actively participated in all the steps of production from

selecting the works to be featured in the book, photo-

graphing his art pieces using a digital camera, guiding in the computer editing process, writing and editing text, finding and choosing the quotes used on the divider pages, finalizing

the categories for the images, and advising on the final layout, including the cover design. He also painted the portraits of his daughter and son-in-law featured on the preceding page.

The artist hopes that the symbols and realistic images in the collection of people and animals – their faces and forms – will leave visitors to this "gallery in print" uplifted and inspired.






